

Affidavit of Loss / Release of Interest:

This vehicle comes with a notarized "Affidavit of Loss / Release of Interest" form signed by the owning agency. If you would like to title this vehicle in Washington State, the "Affidavit of Loss / Release of Interest" and the Bill of Sale will be sufficient to transfer ownership at a Department of Licensing location.

For buyers living outside of Washington State, please check with your State's Department of Licensing office for instructions regarding the registration and transfer of ownership of vehicles without a Title prior to bidding.

Destroyed (Totaled) Vehicle:

This vehicle has been reported as a total loss with Washington State Department of Licensing (DOL). The title has been destroyed, and a Total Loss Claim Settlement Report has been filed with the Washington State DOL. If you would like to title this vehicle in Washington State, please see attached word document for further instruction.

For buyers living outside of Washington State, please check with your State's Department of Licensing office for instructions regarding the registration and transfer of ownership of vehicles destroyed in Washington State prior to bidding.

Ownership in Doubt:

This vehicle/vessel is being sold as "Ownership in Doubt". It does not come with a Title. The winning bidder will receive a Bill of Sale with the Unit. To license this vehicle/vessel in Washington State, the winning can take the Bill of Sale to the DOL and fill out an "Ownership in Doubt" form. The "Ownership in Doubt" label will remain with this vehicle/vessel for 3 years after the date of sale.

For buyers living outside of Washington State, please check with your State's Department of Licensing office for instructions regarding the registration and transfer of ownership of vehicle/vessel without a Title prior to bidding.

Formerly Undercover:

When transferring ownership of this vehicle, DOL may need to recreate this title. Please be aware that this may take extra time as DOL verifies the ownership and validity of the documentation. All efforts will be made to process the title transfer as efficiently as possible. No brand will appear on the new title.

Totaled but not a total loss:

Owning agency says accident totaled - the owning agency is using the term colloquially. Please be aware that DOL has no record of a total loss on this vehicle and it is being sold with a clear title.

Title: This vehicle is sold with a bill of sale and has a **Release of Interest and Total Loss Settlement Report**, the combination of which should be sufficient for change of ownership within the state of Washington, after repairs are made and a WSP VIN Inspection. Please be aware of any differences or challenges which may arise from your location as our assistance with such issues may be limited.

3 YEAR WAIT. Release of interest filled out only. DOL has no title or its canceled.

This asset has no title paperwork, and no Washington State title record currently exists. This sale will include a BILL OF SALE only. To title the vehicle it will need to undergo a WSP VIN Inspection in order to be eligible for application of a WA ST DOL Three Year Registration. Please see the attached document for details under the "Ownership In Doubt" section.

Please be aware that there are exemptions to needing to title for certain types of assets and exemptions from needing WSP VIN inspections within the State of Washington.
